Mr. Bians had prosecuted Richard Bache, Esq. for an sessult and bettery. One count in the indictment, to aggravate the assault. alleged that it was committed upon Mr. Binns, while he was engaged in the execution of his duties as a magistrate. When the counsel of Mr. Bache admitted the assault upon the person of the prosecutor, provoked, as it had in that state. been, by the most gross personal abuse of the defendant in a public newspaper, of which the prosecutor was the editor. they contended, in the appropriate legal forms, and by argument, that Mr Binns was not an aiderman of magis trate, because he had accepted and ex ercited the employment or appoint ment, from the general government of publisher of the laws of the United States, in contravention of the constitution and daws of Pennsylvania which vacate any state office or appoint ment held by any person accepting any office, appointment, or subordinate ageney, from the executive, legislative, or ment, in which Chief Justice Gibson concurred, vacating the commission of Mr. Binns as alderman. Judge Tod, Judge Houston, and Judge Smith dissented; and being a majority of the court, they of course ruled the com mission of Mr. Binns to be valid.

Chief Justice Gibson then sounced the unenimous opinion of the court, in which, while they sentenced Mr. Bedje to the payment of a fine 100 dollars for the assault, they soi- had killed it, and that it was impossible medverted with great severity upon be gross personal provocation which led to it.—Aurora.
