THE plaintiff in this cause, Honoré René, a f. w. of c. having married the defendant, Marie-Françoise Cheval, a f. w. of c. in 1826, has now instituted a suit against her for both, a separation from bed and board and divorce, from her, on the ground that she has rendered herself guilty of adultery, by running away from the matrimonial domicile with a certain individual of the name of Delille Bayard, and continuing to live with the same at his house, and dwelling since some time last year 1829, in open perpetration of her said guilt.

Whereupon the defendant having failed to answer to this demand, and judgment having been entered against her accordingly by default; the court, at a regular trial of the cause, for confirmation of said judgment, having been fully satisfied by the evidence on record, that such has been the culpable behaviour of the said defendant towards her husband, the plaintiff in the present case; it is ordered and decreed, that judgment be rendered in favour of the said plaintiff, Honoré René, with costs to be paid by defendant, Marie-Françoise Cheval.
