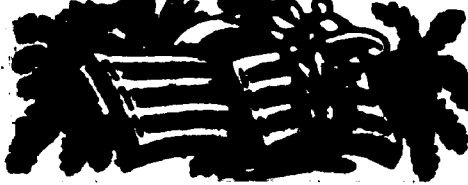

Parish Court for the Parish and City of New-Orleans—Present the hon. James F. Cheval.

Monsieur René vs. his wife, Marie F. Cheval. THE plaintiff in this cause, Monsieur René, a f. m. c. having married the defendant, Marie-Françoise Cheval, a f. w. c. in 1826, has now instituted a suit against her for both, a separation from bed and board and divorce, from her, on the ground that she has rendered herself guilty of adultery, by running away from the matrimonial domicile with a certain individual of the name of Delile Bayard, and continuing to live with the same at his house, and dwelling since some time last year 1829, in open perpetration of her said guilt.

Whereupon the defendant having failed to answer to this demand, and judgment having been entered against her accordingly by default, the court, at a regular trial of the cause, for confirmation of said judgment, having been fully satisfied by the evidence on record, that such has been the culpable behaviour of the said defendant towards her husband, the plaintiff in the present case; it is ordered and decreed, that judgment be rendered in favour of the said plaintiff, Honoré René, with costs to be paid by defendant, Marie-Françoise Cheval, and it is further ordered by the Court, that pursuant to the provision of sect. 4 of the laws of the 19th March 1827, that the said defendant remaining convicted of adultery the parties of this suit are not only separated from bed and board, but are moreover by this judgment, divorced from each other, and thereby placed forever, by the dissolution of the bonds of matrimony between them, on the same condition, with respect to each other as if no marriage had ever been contracted between them.
