BUMBARDMEST OF ALGIERS. The brig Attakanas arrived on Satur day evening, from Marina, which port she left on the 30th of last month, with dates up to that day. The papers contain no news, but a letter of the 30th, announces the arrival of a vessel reporting the news of the hombardment of Algiers, by the French squadson. We have obtained the following informations from a passenger of the Attakapas, who spoke himself to the captain and passengers of that vessel. He says that a ship from Barcelona had aprived in 38 days from the Strait of Gibraltar, bringing the news that the French expedition to Algiers had completed its disembarcation on the 15th of June, and that the attack on the City was made on the 17th. They said that the cannonade was heard for more then five hours, while the vessel was passing along the coast, but have not been informed of the result.

We give the above as we have recrived it, without answering for its authenticity.
