DREADFUL RIOTS AT BRISTOL.

Sunday morning, Oct. 21st. Our readers have of length had some idea of the riotousness in the city of Bristol.

On the 21st of the Guildhall the grand jury returned their verdict, but many started off to the square.

As we said yesterday, a letter from Trieste, of the 19th Oct. announces, in a manner which will not allow of any doubt, that the governor of the province had received orders for an immediate reduction of the Austrian army.

Paris, Oct. 30th. We have to-day the particulars of the death of Cap. d'Istria. This event cannot have appeared, although it may have shocked you.

There was a good deal of talk about the riotousness in Bristol, and the destruction of property and the loss of life.

Not much further violence was offered, except putting several rows of large stones across the streets to impede the progress of the cavalry.
