GENERAL REMARKS. The weather has been extremely unfavorable to out-door affairs, on account of frequent and heavy rains. The Mississippi has fallen 18 inches, and was yesterday 5 feet below water mark.

COTTON.—Arrived since the 29th ult., of N. Alabama and Tennessee 606 bales. Cleared in the same time, for Liverpool 1686, Nantz 1565, Bremen 52, New-York 67; together 3370; making a reduction in stock of 2761, and leaving on the 4th inst., a stock of 24,160 bales.

Transaction of the week, as far as we are informed, amount to about 1200 bales, of which 500 Tennessee were sold at 91 cents round, a mixed lot comprising a portion of every quality; another lot of about 500 Alabama and Tennessee at 84 round; 100 bales Louisiana and Mississippi at 81 and 82, and 30 bales at 91 cents—together with minor transactions at former rates, which we continue to quote. There is yet a fair demand, and the business in treaty is quite respectable for the season.

SUGAR & MOLASSES, on plantation, continue to be sold at former rates, and notwithstanding the lateness of the season vessels are yet loading on the coast. The supply in town is about the same as usual, and the price without change. Cleared since our last report of Sugar, for N.-York 12 hhd. Baltimore 514, Boston 80 hhd. Molasses, Baltimore 19 hhd., 112 bbls., Boston 35 hhd.—together 106 hhd. sugar, 51 hhd. 112 bbls. molasses.

Tobacco.—No sales have come to our knowledge this week, except a damaged lot sold for account of the insurers. The market rarely presents so lively a prospect as at the present moment, and for the last few days large quantities have come in, and yet larger are leaving the city—the warehouses are busy receiving discharging for shipment, and turning out for inspection—drays loaded are seen in every direction, and the Levee is covered with an unusual quantity. Notwithstanding the large Stock on hand, it is said that very little remains in first hands—the reduction in freights has operated much to the benefit of the article, and it is highly probable that the greater part, perhaps the whole, of the old crop on hand, will be cleared out before the new makes its appearance. Arrived this week 1118 hhd. Cleared, for Bremen 239, New-York 23, Boston 175—leaving on hand, inclusive of all on ship-board not cleared on the 4th inst., a Stock (corrected) of 12,640 hhd.

FLOUR.—We have no change to notice whether of price or demand—it is the same as last remarked, plenty and dull at 84 for Bakers, 83 75 for Shipping, 83 25 for Sour.

PORK.—There has been nothing done worthy of note—plenty, dull, and nominal in price are yet applicable.

WHISKEY is quite dull at 35 cents; some holders ask more, but, except by retail, no sales within our knowledge have exceeded that price.

LARD.—An arrival this week brought in 1814 pigs. We have not heard of sales, and quote as last week, 84 45 per 100 lbs.

BAGGING & BALE ROPE.—We continue to quote as last week, but remark that they are now comparatively dull. Arrived this week 257 pieces bagging, 972 coils rope.

LARD continues scarce, and in good demand at 10 cents.

LIME, Thomaston, is in good demand, last sales 82 25 per bbl.

MACKEREL are looking up at last; they are scarce, and No. 3 has been sold at 63 per bbl. In other Nos. nothing has yet been done.
