REPORT OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE, ON THE TARIFF BILL.

Sir,
In discharge of an assigned duty, I have the honor, herewith, to transmit an expression of the opinions of both branches of the Legislature, and of the Executive of Massachusetts, on the subject of the protection of the domestic industry of the country, and the expediency, policy, and various tendency of the Tariff Bill, now pending before the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States—the passage of which is deprecated as a measure, fatal to the property, independence, and integrity of the Nation, by the Representatives of the people of this Commonwealth.

The Joint Committee, appointed to consider a motion of the Governor's Address as it relates to the proceedings of a late convention of the people of South Carolina, and the policy thereof, and also the Resolutions of the State of Pennsylvania thereon; and to whom have been referred the Resolutions of the State of New Hampshire upon the subject of the Proclamation of the President of the United States in reference to the same, have entered on the consideration of the matters entrusted to them, and respectfully submit the following report, in part.

On examining the proceedings of the late Convention of the people of South Carolina, the committee find, that they announced, on the part of that State, pretensions of a novel and dangerous character, which, if persisted in, and carried into practice, can only terminate in the destruction of the Government. South Carolina claims for herself a right to secede from the Union, and to establish a separate government, independent of the Government of the United States, which she may regard as unconstitutional, and has undertaken to exercise this right, in reference to the laws imposing duties on the importation of foreign goods.

Such pretensions, made in so respectable a quarter, with every appearance of earnestness, and solemnly communicated to the Government of this Commonwealth, will naturally require from the General Court the expression of some opinion upon their correctness, and consistency with the Constitution and laws of the country.
