EMBARGO ON DUTCH VESSELS TAKEN OFF

EMBARGO ON DUTCH VESSELS TAKEN OFF.

Supplement to the London Gazette of Tuesday, May 29.

WEDNESDAY, May 29, 1933.

At the court at St. James's, the 20th day of May, 1833, present, the King's most excellent Majesty in Council. It is this day ordered by his Majesty in Council, that his Majesty's Order in Council of the 6th November last, directing that no ships or vessels belonging to any of his Majesty's subjects be permitted to clear out for any of the ports within the dominions of the King of the Netherlands until further orders; and that an embargo be laid upon all ships and vessels belonging to the subjects of the King of the Netherlands which then were, or which should thereafter come into any of the ports, harbors, or roads within any part of his Majesty's dominions; and that the commanders of his Majesty's ships of war should detain and bring into port all increbant ships and vessels bearing the flag of the Netherlands, be recoved, and the same is hereby pyroked accordingly; and it is hereby further ordered, that the said neutremanus, he revoked, and the same is hereby revoked accordingly; and it is hereby further ordered, that the said embargo be taken off, and that all such ships and vessels be permitted to depart with their cargoes to their respective ports of destination; and the Right Hon, the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the nicessary directions therein as to them may instructively appedrain.
