Act of the Legislature, approved 1st March 1830.
ART. 5. And be it further enacted, That the Mayor and Recorder shall be chosen from among the citizens who are heads of families, and resident within the city at the time of their election, and possess the other qualifications required by the existing laws:

"All our fellow citizens, if the law requires this as a condition in completing the eligibility of a candidate for the place of Mayor, judge if respect for public manners and morals, does not more eloquently evince that it should be found in its candidate for the office of Governor."
