New Orleans 22d November, 1833.

THE Legion of Louisiana will under arms the  
Sunday 22d December, at 9 A.M. precisely, in the pub-  
lic square, to receive the commandant-in-chief, and to  
celebrate the anniversary of the memorable battle of the  
23d December, 1814, a day for ever dear to the remem-  
brance of Louisianians.

The subalterns and soldiers must be provided with 20  
blanks cartridges, the muskets and cartridge boxes will be  
most impeded by the officers of the companies.

The artillery will provide itself with 30 rounds for each  
cannon.

The officers commanding the companies are to give an  
exact account of their men and subalterns.

The commanding officers of the different companies must  
rend a parole to shut and guard the same half an hour  
before the time fixed for the review.
