MELANCHOLY ACCIDENT:

Yesterday evening at 9 o'clock, the steamer Bonnwick, from Point Chico, came in contact with the steamer Bonaire, 80 ft. long, about 15 miles above this city, and steered by her, the result immediately fatal. The Bonnwick immediately cast off her yawl, which picked up several persons from the water. The Bonnwick immediately turned round, and in that space of time there was only about 40 feet of her upper deck above water—she have a rope aboard, which was used fast to a stanchion, by which means the remaining persons on board were saved. It is supposed that there was about 100 passengers—only one sailor's passenger was lost. Of the deck hands and passengers about 100 were lost, of which number there was 2 women and 3 children. The boat and cargo is a total loss.

MUNICIPAL PROCEEDINGS.

Sitting of the Recorder, Mr. McCready, Mercer, Peleg, Clark, Labatt, Barnes, and others, October 25th.

The prov. verdict of the last sitting having been read, the secretary read the following letter from the Mayor, together with that of Mr. Pritchard:

MAYORITY OF NEW ORLEANS,

25th October, 1862.

To the Recorder and Members of the City Council,  
Gentlemen—I have the honor to transmit to you, inclosed herewith, the resignation of Mr. R. O. Pritchard, one of the representatives of one of the wards, and the population of New Orleans, and at the same time inform you that I have participated the election of an alderman in the place of Mr. Gustave Schenck, to the same day that the one to replace Mr. Pritchard took place, that is to say, until November 1st. I have taken this course in order to satisfy the gentlemen who sat at those elections.

On the 30th November last, the forming of the levee duty a sum of \$100,000, levied, streaming from the leading up to the four-hundredth Almudaneau and Bayou St. John, will be suspended according to an income of the Council. In the meanwhile, I think it would be expedient for the Council to fix upon the minimum of the price. I beg you to observe that last year there were formed out of \$100,000, I have the honor to be, &c. &c.

The secretary began to read sundry petitions, when Mr. Hermecourt read and said, Mr. Pritchard, in the article of his resignation, it is provided that "Letters written to the Council, and the business left unfinished at the last adjournment, shall be carried over to all other matters that set the order of the day, and the same may be referred to the committee with whom they are left." The report of Mr. Pritchard's plan made by Dr. D'Haussoncourt to the Council, and the business which was in progress in the preceding session, he terminated, unless the ex-officer, or two-thirds of the members present, decide otherwise.

He moved, That the Council justify Mr. D'Haussoncourt, if necessary, in his action, and his account to the report of the committee, with whom these were left, for the sake of his having involuntarily, and therefore should not injure the reputation of Dr. D'Haussoncourt.

The says and says having been called, is appeared that M. Labatt, Horowitz, Montagu and D'Innes, had voted for the adoption, and M. Pritchard and M. Mongat had voted in the negative. The recorder gave the casting vote for the negative.
