JOURNAL OF THE SENATE.

Wednesday 4th March 1836.

The senate met at 10 o'clock.

Members present: Messrs. Charles Desbryz...

Reading of Messages from the House.

Amendments of the house, in the bill entitled 'An act to incorporate the Roman Catholic Church...

Resolution relative to the location of the School Land.

Resolution prohibiting the introduction of bills or resolutions after the 9th March inst.

An act to incorporate the New-Orleans Gas Light and Banking Company.

An act granting additional powers to the different parish judges of the state of Louisiana.

An act granting appropriations to improve the navigation of the rivers West Pearl, Boque Chitto Boque Falia, Tangipahoa, Natchitoches, Ticklaw and Amite.

An act to change the boundary line, dividing the parishes of Livingston and St Helena.

On motion of Mr. Moore, this bill was laid on the table indefinitely.

Resolution instructing our senators and representatives in congress, to obtain a grant of land, for the benefit of the Ackafalaya Rail Road and Banking Company.

On motion of M. Reid, the rules were dispensed with, and the resolution was passed and taken to the house.

Resolution relative to the improvement of the bayou Teche.

On motion of M. Reid, the rules were dispensed with, and the resolution passed and taken to the house.

M. Lacoste, after leave obtained, introduced a resolution granting leave of absence to Gilbert Leonard, judge of the parish of Plaquemine.

The president laid before the senate, a communication from the state treasurer, relative to the questions addressed to him by the legislature, with regard to the means of supplying the deficit which would be occasioned by the suspension of gambling licenses.

On motion of M. Reid, a bill which on Monday last had been fixed for the special order of the day, and entitled 'An act to prevent gambling,' was taken up and referred to a committee, composed of Messrs. Moore, Nicholas and Brownson.

The committee reported, to wit: to suspend the bill, until to-morrow, and the bill not to lose its order.

Second Reading.

Resolution relative to outstanding debts.

An act for the relief of Henry Keane, of the parish of East Baton Rouge.

Resolution relative to the public lands in the parish of Plaquemine.

An act to provide for ascertaining and fixing the boundary lines of adjoining parishes.

A message from the house of Representatives, brought by M. A. Cavillier, their clerk pro tempore, informed the senate that the house had concurred in the bills entitled 'An act to repeal so much of an act entitled 'an act for the organization and discipline of the militia of the state of Louisiana, as divides the militia into two classes,' and 'An act to incorporate the Freeman's charitable association of New-Orleans.' That the house had concurred, with amendments, in the bill entitled 'an act to regulate the administration of the charity hospital of the city of New-Orleans.'

The same message requested the concurrence of the senate in the bills and resolution entitled:

'An act to repeal as far as it concerns the parishes of St. Bernard, the act entitled 'an act to establish courts of criminal jurisdiction, in the parishes composed of St. Louis, Iberville, and St. Charles.'

'An act to incorporate the Home patent brick manufacturing company, in the parish of Livingston.'

'An act further to amend the charter of the West Feliciana rail road company.'

'An act granting a copensation to the state treasurer.'

'An act declaring certain offices vacant by the permanent removal of the incumbents from the parish, and providing for the appointment of their successors.'

Resolution requesting the board of public works to cause the Beau Rivier to be examined and surveyed.

A message from the governor, brought by M. A. F. Estell, his private secretary, informed the senate that he approved and signed the bill entitled, 'an act to repeal the act appointing cotton weighers, approved March 24th, 1827.'

On motion, the senate adjourned until to-morrow, at 10 o'clock A. M.
