The fire on Thursday evening proved too palpably the inefficient number of fire engines and companies in this city. Of these there are but six-assuredly inadequate in any emergency, however energetic and resolved may remen. This leads us again to reflect on the different insurance companies, for the little regard they pay to the tire companies. Strictly speaking every insurance company should have a fire engine and corps attached to its establishment; and all assist each for mutual safety and protection. It is as ungenerous as improper that the lubor and expence of extinguishing fires should be left to enterprizing individuals who are fortunately more public spirited than the soulless companies of insurance. Yet these companies find themselves eventually the losers by their own niggardliness, in ransoming the property destroyed by their own neglect. It would be well if the state legislature passed a law enjoining each and every insurance company to maintain an engine and corps of all occasions of fire: this is the system pursued in Lon. den, and it has been found effectual not only in promptly extinguishing or precautiously preventing fires, but absolutely in forwarding the anterests of the companies themselves, by inducing every householder to have his property insured that it may be protected by the companies. It is increfore the interestias well as the duty of insurance companies to have each a fire engine and corps belonging to it.

We also witnessed the want of the city police to preserve order at the fire; and to prevent property frem being plundered. We did not observe one policeman prewent during the whole time of the fire, which continued upwards of three hours; and we learned that in consecutive quence of that neglect, valuable property to a large mount was plundered by those who pretended to assist.
