MATAMOROS, 11th May, 1836.

DEAR SIR: We have learned here within a few days that Gen. Houston has gained a signal victory over Santa Anna beyond the Brazos de Dice, by which the Mexican Commander, together with Generals Cos and Castrillon, and about 600 troops, temained prison-ers of war in the hands of the Texisns. An equal number was left dead on the field, and the remains of the middle division, consisting of about 380, have fallen back on the Colorado mider Pilisoli. Our Ayuntaback on the Colorado mader Fairon. Our Ayunta-miento were preparing to receive Santa Anna in triumph, as it was somewised that, his work being fin-ished, he would in a few days pass through Manageror on his return to Mexico, when this news came upon-them like a thunder-clap, and turned their feigned rejoicings into others more real, though less open. The day previous a decree had arrived from Maxico relieving all prisoners (except leaders) from the seatence e death, which had been persod on them. The fourteen unfortunate individuals confined here, who were lately so near a tregical end, are thus freed from the appre-hension of massacre; and Matamoros will escape the stain which every one feared would be left on it. They stain which every one secred weath be left on a. They were sentenced about 35 days ago, in obedience the orders of Santa Anna, which were for the third time repeated, and accompanied with thrents against Gen. Fernandes for his delay. The prisoners were notified in the evening that they must propers for death at an early hour in the morning. Their apprehensions had in a great measure passed away when this audden. warning was given. I made, I believe, the first move towards procuring the delay which has saved them.— Having consulted with Lesero, I drew up a petition to Gen. Fernandez, praying for the three-days grace or capille, which the laws concede to every criminal, and had it signed by the prisoners. Fernandes dessurred much at the responsibility of granting it, but at a late bour was prevailed on by Losero and others to do it.
At the same time the American consul addressed him At the same time the American consult sourcessed him an official note protesting against the cruel act as con-trary to the laws of nations. The sensation which prevailed not only among the foreigners, but also the better class of natives, was very great, and the military better class of natives, was very great, and the military authorities esemed apprehensive of a disturbance or a rescue: for the guards were doubled, all the officers were on duty, and the consul's house was watched by patroles till moraing.
