It was very fortunate for the owners or underwriters of the brig George that the weather was fine and that the water happened to be smooth, otherwise the vessel must have met with some serious Injury, for she lay about thirty-six hours in a very critical situation. I neerly mention that those prople who are making such a handle of the case of the Appollo getting aground on the har with the Mississippi spitot on board, are very liable to be in the same situation, though they take good care to say but very little ab, ut it. "Folks who live in glass houses should never throw stone."
