OF WILLS AND TESTAMENTS.

This branch of legal science is as little encombered as any other with technical phraseology, and it is one that most extitingly comes home to the "business and besons" of almost all of us, in our turn.

It has sometimes been asked, by what right it is that men exercise power after their death! Why is it that when the tomb encloses the body, and the voice, and the hand, are powerless, their owner may still speak, and still have his will as to the property he has left behind? While we live, we may use, give, or destroy our property, for it is ours—nechure it; when we disc have it no longer we can no longer gra-p it or keep it. Why, then, are we allowed to control it?—The answer usually is, that there is no natural right of the ki od, no natural or moral obligation upon the survivers to execute the will of a person decoased. It is a conventional right; the creature of civil society from principles of public poldey. It promotes the accumulation of property, as it is one of the incidents that make it valuable. As men wish to have the property for the sake of the power, they will make more exertion, and be led more specifily to the attendant vintures of industry, entrypies and connow.
