New York Elections.

The charter election in the city of New York has runningly, as expected, in the success of the locusing sees. The vote, according to the Herald, is as follows:—Mickle (loco.) 22.114; Taylor (whap 15.043; Cozzons (nature) 8,081. Mickle has a majority over Taylor of 7,071 votes, and Taylor and Cozzons have a majority over Mickle of 1,137.

In the Board of Aldermen and Common Council the locus have a large majority.

The whig vote has nearly doubled since last year, while the natives have fallen off in precisely the same proportion. The result teaches the latter a lesson of which they stood in need. Since 1843 their vote has been regularly deminishing at every election; until they are now left with a comparative handful of adherents.
