First Municipality Council.—Pursuant to adjournment this Council met last evening, eight members taking their seats at about 8 o'clock.

A message was read from the Mayor in which he vetoed the resolution of the Council at their last meeting which prohibits the selling of poultry and eggs in any other part of the Municipality accept under the market houses of said Municipality. He considered it an oppressive measure and trusted the Council would coincide with him.

Mr Hermann moved that the Council concur with the view of the Mayor, which was adopted.

Mr Hagan presented a report from the Improvement Committee recommending the widening of front Leves street, and paving the same with square stone, as soon as practicable. They also recommend the paving with square stone, chartres street from Canal to St Peter street, as its condition at present is such that it is impossible to repair it. The Committee calculated that the paving of the front Leves and of Chartres street will be about \$128,000, from which must be deducted the value of present paving stone to be used on some other streets. This deduction amounts to \$61,000, thereby diminishing the cost about one-half. The cost of the above will be saved to the Municipality in a few years. They also recommend the propriety of paving with round stone Customhouse street from Royal to Rampart streets, which is now laid with woodentblocks. For the payment of these improvements the Committee suggest the following mode of payment: for the pavement of front Leves on Chartres street, say, in bonds of the Municipality payable in 10 years with micrest a six per cent payable semi-annually. They recommend that sesied proposals be received by the Council for the completion of the work. Old Leve is to 60 feet wide from cut to care. It was made the order of the day for the next meeting.

After some further business of a routine nature the Council adjourned to next Monday evening.


