We are all aware of the perfect in-ability of Mexico to engage directly in such enter-prises, as she has neither the officers, seamen nor vessels for the purpose; and the subjects of other na-tions, will, therefore, be very catitious how they em-bark in such adventures, as of course they will be fully aware that in case of capture (a highly proba-ble result) a most rigid scrutiny will be mide into their right, as foreigners, to carry on private ring under the Mexican flag. the Mexican flag.
