Washington, June 16, 1846.

To the Senate of the United States:

In answer to a resolution of the Senate of the 3rd instant, I communicate herewith estimates prepared by the War and Navy Departments of the probable expenses of conducting the existing war with Mexico during the remainder of the present and the whole of the next facal year. I communicate also a report of the Secretary of the Treasury, based upon these estimates, containing recommendations of measures for raising the additional means required. It is probable that the annual expenses incurred during the period specified may fall considerably below the estimates submitted, which are for a larger number of troops than have yet been called to the field. As a precautionary measure, however, against any deficiency, the estimates have been made at the largest amount which any state of the service may require. It will be precived from the Report of the Servicary of the Treasury that a considerable portion of the additional amount required may be raised by a modification of the raises of duty imposed by the existing Tariff laws. The high dutiest present leaved on many articles totally exclude them from importation, whilst the quantity and amount of others which are imported are greatly diminished.
