Treasury Circular.

The Government paper publishes a circular addressed by the Secretary of the Treasury to Collectors Receivers, Treasurers of the Mint and Branch Mints. assistant Treasurers, Disbursing Agents and officers of the Government of the United States. The object of this document is to provide against the possiofficers to the 20th and 21st sections of the Sub-1 rea-sury Act, inflicting penalties for contravention of those provisions which require payments to be made in gold and silver; and prescribing as the duty of the Secretary of the Treasury to issue fitting instructions in order to carry these provisions into effect. In con-formity with the law Mr. WALKER publishes the fol-

owing regulations:-Ist All Government drafts shall be made payable o order, and not to bearer.

All They shall be assignable only by special en-lorsement.

18t. All Government drafts shall be made psyable to order, and not to bearer.

2d. They shall be assignable only by special endouscement.

3d. They shall be presented for payment at the places where payable, namely: If psyable at a place distant not more than filty miles from the seat of Government of the United States, they must be presented within twenty days from the date of the draft. If psyable at a place distant more than filty miles from the seat of Government, and not exceeding one hundred miles, they must be presented within forty days from the date of the draft. If payable at a place distant more than one hundred miles and not exceeding four hundred, from the seat of Government, they must be presented within aixty days from the date of the draft. If payable at a place more than two hundred miles from the seat of Government, and not exceeding four hundred, they must be presented within a payable at any place exceeding four hundred miles from the seat of Government, and not exceeding four hundred, they must be presented within minety days from the date of the draft; and if payable at any place exceeding four hundred miles from the seat of Government, and most exceeding four hundred miles from the seat of Government, they must be presented within minety days from the date of the draft; and if payable at any place exceeding four hundred miles from the seat of Government, they must be presented within minety days from the date of the draft; and if payable at any place exceeding four hundred miles from the seat of Government, and the source of the United States, when such order shall be made for the payment of such drafts as will best comport with the public interest, and tend to prevent deather the public interest is

HABEAN CORPUS FOR THE LIBERATION OF A FEMALE SLAVE.—On Tuesday, (says the Boston Post, before Chief Justice Shaw, in lobby, Andrew Hunter vs. Augustus Taft, temporarily a resident of Usbridge, requiring him to shew cause why heheld in restrained a colored female named Christine, believed, by the petioner, to be held as a slave. In reply to this writ, the respondent answered, in writing, under oath, that Christine was his slave in South Carolina; that he brought her into this commonwealth voluntarily; and that she had not been restrained of her liberty here, but, on the contrary, was free to go or come, at her own will and pleasure. His honor, therefore, passed no order in the premises, except to discharge the respondent under the writ; and Christine returned to Uxbridge with Mr. T.
