His very means of subsistence depend upon that caprictious and changeable power. If he braves it, he is lost; if he seeks to concluste it, he must frequently do so at the inevitable expense of ruth, honor and integrity. We say that the State has no right to place its cutions in pestions at once so painful and so dancerous; and we say further, that it is all but impossible for a magistrate elected by the people, antious to he re elected, and having no other sources of emolument than his official submendiate and fearless probity which at all immuculate and fearless probity which at all
