SENATOR LANE'S RESOLUTION FOR VOTING MARCH 23.
REPORT OF THE REVENUE COMMISSIONER.
GOLD CLOSED AT 130 1/4.

Washington, March 15.—Senator Lane's resolution was adopted yesterday by the Senate, providing for the adjournment of the Senate until the 23rd of March. The resolution was passed by a vote of 24 yeas and 12 nays. The adjournment will take place on the 23rd of March, unless there be a change in the date.

The report of the Revenue Commissioner for the year 1865 is before the Senate. It contains a full and complete statement of the receipts and expenditures of the Treasury for that year. The total receipts were \$34,440,000, and the total expenditures were \$33,100,000, leaving a surplus of \$1,340,000.

The gold market closed yesterday at 130 1/4. The price of gold has been steadily rising since the beginning of the year, and is now at its highest point since the outbreak of the rebellion.

Cotton closed at forty-one cents. The price of cotton has been falling since the beginning of the year, and is now at its lowest point since the outbreak of the rebellion.
