CHARTER

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA STATE OF LOUISIANA PARISH OF ORLEANS CITY OF NEW ORLEANS
BE IT KNOWN that on the 12th day of the month of February, in the year of our Lord the thousand nine hundred and four, before me, KENNETH F. FLORENCE, a Notary Public, in and for the Parish of Orleans, State of Louisiana, duly commissioned and sworn, were present the undersigned persons, whose names and addresses are hereunto subscribed, who, being duly sworn, avowing themselves of the provisions of the laws of the State of Louisiana relative to the organization of a corporation, and in pursuance of the provisions of the laws of the State of Louisiana, they have formed a corporation under the laws of the State of Louisiana, and have adopted the following articles of incorporation, which, being read to them, and they having declared that they had read the same, and that they were acquainted with the contents thereof, and that they agreed to be bound by the same, I have hereunto subscribed my name, and affixed the seal of my office, in witness whereof, I have hereunto subscribed my name, and affixed the seal of my office, on the date and at the place first above written, in the presence of the undersigned persons, who are hereunto subscribed as witnesses, and their names and addresses are hereunto subscribed.

ARTICLE I.
The name and title of the corporation hereby formed is to be the H. W. SLOAN COMPANY LIMITED, under which name it shall have and enjoy corporate existence for the period of sixty-one years, and shall have and exercise for the purposes of the business to be carried on by it, all the powers conferred by law upon corporations.

ARTICLE II.
The domicile of this corporation shall be in the City of New Orleans, Louisiana. All citation or other legal process shall be served on the President of the company, or in his absence, on the Secretary and Treasurer.

ARTICLE III.
The objects and purposes for which this corporation is organized and the nature of the business to be carried on by it, are hereby declared to be the conducting of the business of buying and selling, or either on orders and the exporting of cotton, and other commodities, and the carrying of business on cotton and other commodities, to act as agent or attorney in fact for any individual, firm or corporation for the purchase of cotton and other commodities, to buy, sell, receive, and dispose of, by assignment, mortgage, or otherwise, all property, real, personal or incorporeal, choses in action, notes, bills of exchange, or otherwise, to borrow money and pledge, mortgage, or hypothecate any property belonging to it, to sue and be sued in its own name, or in the name of any of its agents or officers.

ARTICLE IV.
The capital stock of this corporation is hereby fixed at ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) divided into one hundred shares (\$100.00 each, which said shares shall be paid for in cash or its equivalent in real estate merchandise or otherwise, in such manner as may be determined by the Board of Directors. All transfers of stock shall be made on the books of said company on the amount of cash or the value of the property received in payment thereof. The said shares shall be subscribed to and paid for by the following persons, to-wit: H. W. Sloan, A. Franklin Fugh and N. P. Sloan, each \$1,000.00; E. J. St. Julien, \$500.00; and N. P. ARTICLE V.
All the directors of this corporation shall be elected at an annual meeting to be held on the first Monday in January in each year. The Board of Directors shall consist of three members, each of whom shall be elected for a term of three years, and shall hold office until their successors shall be elected.

ARTICLE VI.
All elections shall be by ballot, and shall be held at the office of the Secretary, under the supervision of two commissioners to be appointed for that purpose by the Board of Directors. Each share of stock shall be entitled to one vote, to be cast by its owner, either in person or by proxy, and a majority of the votes cast shall elect. This corporation shall not be dissolved by failure to hold an annual meeting or by election of directors, but in case of such failure the said annual meeting shall be held as soon thereafter as possible. Until the said annual meeting is held, the Board of Directors shall have the power to do all such things as may be necessary for the carrying on of the business of this corporation.

ARTICLE VII.
No stockholder shall ever be held liable or responsible for the debts or obligations of this corporation in any further sum than the unpaid balance due to the corporation on the shares owned by him, nor shall any such liability in any manner be extended beyond the amount of such stock.

ARTICLE VIII.
At the termination of this charter, by limitation of otherwise, the business and affairs of this corporation shall be liquidated by two commissioners to be appointed from among the stockholders at a meeting called after ten days prior notice in writing shall have been given by the Secretary and Treasurer to each stockholder by his or her authorized agent, said notice to be delivered in person or sent by mail. Said commissioners shall be elected, and their duties defined, and their compensation fixed by a majority of the shares of stock of the corporation or company. Said commissioners shall be sworn to in office until they have fully liquidated, and in case of the death of one member of said commissioners, the survivor or survivors shall continue to act.

This act of incorporation may be changed, amended or for the time being suspended by a vote of three-fourths of the stockholders convened for such purpose after ten days' notice shall have been given in the manner as set forth in the first paragraph of this article.

This done and passed at my office at New Orleans, Louisiana, aforesaid, the day, month and year first above written, in the presence of Hildelone Koster and D. W. Wilcox, competent witnesses of lawful age, domiciled in this City, who heretofore sign their names with the said act of incorporation, after the reading of these presents.
