HAPPENINGS 69 YEARS AGO.

An Editor's Thanksgiving Sermon: Since last year at this time, we have licked a nation, and fed another, of about the same population. We have killed a few thousand Mexicans and saved the lives of ten times as many Irishmen; so there remains a handsome thanksgiving balance in our favor.

The Caledonian Mercury states that Professor Sir James Y. Simpson of Edinburgh, has lately used successfully chloroform instead of ether as an anæsthetic, generally no inhalation apparatus is necessary. A few drops put on a handkerchief and thus applied to the mouth or nose produces the desired results in a few seconds.

Slave execution: On Monday last a negro belonging to Mr. D... was executed in our parish jail for the crime of murder. If capital punishment is permitted, the expediency of the law which directs the execution of servants privately instead of making them public examples upon the plantations where their crimes were committed, may well be doubted; though why they should be executed for any crime, is still more difficult of apprehension. Waiving the question of the justice or right of society demanding life in any case as the penalty of crime, it seems exceedingly unreasonable to take the lives of criminal slaves. The State pays the cost of the slave executed, and accomplishes no one of the objects of punishment. The criminal is not reformed nor the law-breaker deterred by the fearful example. Would it not be better to make the criminal a prod for the State for life thus giving him time to or for reformation, while the evil are deterred by the example of a punishment more fearful than death? Vindicating her broker laws in this manner, the State is remunerated for the expense of conviction and for the purchase from his master of the criminal.

No wonder our officers stand so high in the public opinion in Mexico. General Scott is over six feet four. Generals Worth and Twiggs, Colonels Harney and May and Major Lally, are all six feet or upwards, and like Frank (Tranger), "well proportioned." Colonel Doniphan stands six feet two, and as far as altitude is concerned, the next Captain Pike, might pass for his twin brother. Pretty fair specimens of the "perfidious Yankees."

Reconstruction in Louisiana. (Concluded from yesterday.) But this time the Democrats were prepared and barricaded the Republican government in the St. Louis Hotel, then the State Capitol, the Democrats meeting in the old St. Patrick's Hall, where the new post office now stands; all the courts were in the possession of the Democrats and the government went on without interruption, General Grant this time not interfering. Pinchback greatly assisted the Democrats with the result that finally in the Democratic Legislature there was a quorum of members both elected according to the official returns and by the report of the returning board. President Hayes immediately after his inauguration sent a commission of five to Louisiana to investigate the situation and that committee reported when the quorum was obtained as above stated that the Nicholls government should be recognized. Hayes then withdrew the troops from the St. Louis Hotel, thereupon the State House was evacuated and as Professor Fortier ironically puts it in his history of Louisiana, "and reconstruction in Louisiana was then at an end." The date says Mr. Hart, I think was April 26th. Of the actors of the events above mentioned but few survive besides Pinchback, Mr. Estillette being the only other; several of those prominent in the 14th of September and in the events of January 1877 are still, however, in active service or business, and among them may be mentioned W. J. Behan, J. D. Hill, Justice F. A. Monroe, Judge George H. Theard, Captain F. L. Richardson and Judge F. D. King and Judge T. C. W. Ellis. In conclusion says Mr. Hart, it may be stated that the Republican Legislature was very good to the memory of Dunn; by Act No. 3, of 1872, his salary which was \$3,000 per annum was paid from the date of his death to his widow; by Act No. 62 of 1873, \$5,000 was appropriated to her to secure a home this "in view of the valuable public service and high patriotism of her husband and by Act 57 of 1873, the Oscar J. Dunn Monumental Association of Louisiana was created though apparently nothing was ever done thereunder. All of the incorporators but three were negroes and all have long since passed away. (The End)
