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HEMP STALK FRAGMENTS  
FOR PAPER MAKING.

Possibilities of this Waste Material Investigated by Government Specialists.

Washington, D. C., Oct. 19.—That a satisfactory quality of book paper can be made from hemp hards, the waste stalk fragments produced in preparing hemp fiber for market, is a conclusion reached by specialists of the U. S. Department of Agriculture as a result of commercial tests made in cooperation with a paper manufacturer. The experiments and the economic surroundings of the use of hemp hards as a paper-making material are described in a new professional paper of the department of agriculture, bulletin 504.

It is proposed to continue the present railroad in Jackson street directly back to the lake, as nearly parallel, though in the parish of Jefferson, to the canal as practicable, intersecting one or more of the streets of Carrollton. For the use of the road now constructed in Jackson street the Carrollton Railroad and Banking Company shall hold a certain number of shares of stock, if that company is not disposed to become the chief agent in the proposed extension. The length of the extension is seven miles and the estimated cost twenty thousand dollars per mile.

the lake to the Mississippi river at the very point where produce is landed which often seeks the markets of Alabama, a part of Mississippi, and the Florida parishes, a large amount of freight would be regularly obtained which would yearly increase. Materials for building would also find their way by the same road to Lafayette, Bouligny and Carrollton—places where the demand will constantly increase. The trade between New Orleans and Mobile, coastwise, which has hitherto been subjected to onerous burdens, relieved and facilitated, must largely increase, making this project of great importance to both those cities.

If our government was one of compulsion it would be comparatively simple to enforce the laws for its extermination, but as we must depend for laws and their enforcement upon intelligent public opinion, it becomes everyone's duty to join in this health crusade, which, if properly conducted, will mean that consumption in Louisiana can be brought under control within ten years.

Each week, there will appear some little article dealing with consumption, its prevention and its cure.

In this first lesson we beg to call attention to the fact that promiscuous spitting is the greatest source of infection and if we can teach that "No Spitting Means No Consumption," one-half of the battle is gained.

## Universal Military Training Is Beneficial to the Public Health.

New York, N. Y. Oct. 19.—Surgeon General Rupert Blue, of the United States Public Health Service, in a letter to the National Security League gives his unqualified endorsement to universal military training, as beneficial to the public health.

"I believe a system," says Dr. Blue's letter, "under which all the young men of this country could receive military training would be of inestimable value. The outdoor life and physical development which such training guarantees could not fail to improve materially the health and vigor of our entire population."

"Such a system would mean that every young man would receive carefully supervised physical training at an age when the upbuilding of bodily strength is most important—and unfortunately, often neglected. As a preliminary to such training, every youth would be given a thorough physical examination, and the value of this one phase of the system would be enormous, for it would result in the discovery of many physical defects or ailments of which the men themselves might be unaware, and which could be remedied by proper measures.

"It should be remembered also that the elementary principles of hygiene and sanitation form a part of the training of every soldier. The public health value of inculcating these principles in the mind of every youth in the land cannot be overstressed."

President Coolidge, of the United States, Princeton University, writing to the League on the subject of universal training said:

"I have received with interest your letter concerning universal military training. I am very glad to encourage the proposal, contributing my hearty endorsement to the scheme."

"membre pourri, pendu aux côtés de l'Allemagne," la guerre "franche et joyeuse," où l'on pille, où l'on brûle, où l'on vole, la guerre des reîtres et des tire-laines. Il reprochait à l'empereur sa mollesse et son hésitation, et l'empereur avait peur de lui. Il est de tradition chez les Hohenzollern que les fils soient de mauvais fils, et le Kronprinz a de quoi tenir. Quand on saura tous les détails de la tragique agonie de son grand-père Frédéric III à Sun Remo, sous l'œil anxieux des espions de son fils, le Kaiser actuel, on en jugera, et l'on pensera que si Guillaume II a souffert par son héritier, la peine du talion l'a justement frappé. Dans les années qui ont précédé la guerre, la lutte était ouverte entre les amis de l'empereur et ceux du prince impérial.

Dans quelle mesure la pression de l'un sur l'autre a-t-elle précipité la guerre? Il est trop tôt pour l'appréhender; mais quoiqu'il en soit, le Kronprinz est au premier rang des coupables, et ce sont les idées de toute sa vie qui ont reçu statuaire le 2 août, 1914. La déclaration de guerre est la seule victoire qu'il ait remportée, et sans doute qu'à l'heure des sanctions, les Alliés ne l'oublieront pas. Les considérations dynastiques, qui avaient pesé sur l'origine des événements, se retrouvent dans leur développement. Au cours de la bataille de la Marne, le Kronprinz se fait battre par la 38me armée française. On essaie de lui rendre le succès en Argonne; on n'y réussit pas, bien qu'il dispose des meilleurs corps de l'armée allemande. Alors on se décide à lui confier la grande affaire de Verdun, en lui donnant comme conseiller le vieux maréchal de Haesler: nouvel échec. Le vieux maréchal est récompensé; le Kronprinz est décoré. En somme, la carrière du Kronprinz n'a pas justifié l'opinion qu'il avait de lui-même, mais elle a répondu à celle que les Alliés s'étaient formée de ses talents. L'heure est probablement passée des succès qu'il espérait. On ne parle plus à Berlin que de la puissance "défensive" de l'armée allemande. Que ce soit le Kronprinz ou d'autres qui aient charge de l'appliquer, peu importe sans doute aux Alliés, mais, par contre, lorsque viendra le moment de la victoire, leur pensée reviendra vers lui. On peut en être certain.
