Universal Military Training League.

Howard H. Gross, President. Cardinal Gibbons says: "Universal military training would be of immeasurable benefit to the young men of the country. It would not foster militarism but could safeguard the nation."

Thomas A. Edison says: "I believe that a law should be passed to compel every healthy young man in the United States to undergo military training for at least six weeks in each year for a period of six years."

Elihu Root says: "What Americans need is a reawakening of the spirit of a free, self-governing democracy. There was a vast loss of young men in the Civil War because they were led by officers who were wholly ignorant of their duty."

Dr. John Grier Hibben says: "We should not depend on the loyalty of volunteers, when danger threatens the nation. We have not done our duty by them unless we have given them training to enable them to put that spirit to its best uses."

Maj.-General Leonard Wood says: "I feel that the most important question before our country today is adequate preparedness and that this must be based upon universal military training. This training must apply to all young men who are physically fit."
