AMENDMENT TO THE CHARTER OF THE PELICAN LAND & DEVELOPMENT COMPANY, Incorporated.

United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of Orleans, City of New Orleans, State of Louisiana, dated on this 30th day of January, 1917, before ERNEST T. FLORENCE, Notary Public duly commissioned and qualified within and for the Parish of Orleans, State of Louisiana, and in the presence of the undersigned, personally and appeared Galler J. Capdeville and Benjamin L. Weis, of New Orleans, La., herein appearing in their respective capacities as Secretary and Chairman respectively, of stockholders' Committee of the Pelican Land & Development Company, incorporated a corporation domiciled in this city, organized on the 2nd day of June, 1916, and under and by virtue of a resolution passed at the stockholders' meeting hereinabove mentioned, a certified copy of which resolution, hereto attached, was deposited in my possession, which provided that at a special meeting of the stockholders of said corporation, held on the 13th day of January, 1917, which had been duly convened for that special purpose according to law, the following amendments to the charter of said corporation were adopted by unanimous vote of the holders of all stock of said company, present or represented at said meeting, to-wit:

That Article I of said Charter was amended so as to read as follows:

ARTICLE I.

The name and title of the corporation hereby formed is declared to be the Corporation Second Empire Company, the under which name it shall hereafter enjoy corporate existence for the period of ninety-nine years, and shall have and exercise for the purpose of the business to be carried on by it all the powers conferred by law upon corporations, including the power to purchase, lease, sell, mortgage, rent, let, and hold property in the promotion of its business, and to sue and be sued; to make by-laws for its government, and generally to exercise all the powers necessary or convenient in carrying on its business.

That Article IV was amended so as to read as follows:

ARTICLE IV.

The capital of this corporation is hereby fixed at the sum of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00), divided into fifty thousand (50,000) shares of ten dollars (\$10.00) each, payable in cash or its equivalent in real property at the time that the same is issued. Twenty-five thousand seven hundred dollars (\$25,700) of said stock will be held for the stockholders, and the remaining amount of the stock will be held in trust for the stockholders to be used to make by-laws for its government, and generally to exercise all the powers necessary or convenient in carrying on its business.

That Article V of the Charter was amended so as to read as follows:

ARTICLE V.

The affairs of this corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors composed of not less than seven (7) nor more than twenty-two (22) stockholders; said Board shall have the authority to fill all vacancies that may occur from whatsoever cause in said Board in accordance with the annual meetings of the stockholders, and to elect the additional members to the Board.

Whenever an increase in the membership thereof may have been effected, seven directors shall always constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but at any meeting at which a quorum is not had, a less number may adjourn the meeting to another date.

That Article VI of the Charter was amended so as to read as follows:

ARTICLE VI.

The officers of this corporation shall consist of a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary and a Treasurer, which last three may be combined and held by the same person. The officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors and may be removed by the Board at its discretion. The Board of Directors can elect such other officers as it may deem necessary for the proper conduct of the business of the corporation; and it shall have the power and authority to appoint an executive committee of not less than five directors who shall possess and exercise, in addition to the meetings of the Board of Directors, such powers as the Board of Directors may confer.

The first Board of Directors shall be composed of Ernest T. Florence, as President; Galler J. Capdeville as Vice-President, and H. J. Prevois as Secretary-Treasurer.

The whole as above fully appears by the annexed certified copy of the minutes of said stockholders' meeting.
