SUNDAY BASEBALL PLANNED

Proceeds To Be Devoted to Various Units of Army

Chicago, May 25. - Major league baseball on Sunday in all the cities of the Eastern end of the circuit, the gross receipts to be given to various units of the United States army, is what magnates of the American League hope to bring about.

President B. B. Johnson of the league, has already arranged with the approval of Mayor Mitchell of New York for a game in New York on Sunday, June 10, between the New York and St. Louis Americans.

Machinery was set in motion today for the purpose of obtaining permission for American League teams to play championship games on Sunday in Washington, Philadelphia and Boston.

Plans also have practically been completed whereby the American League will provide baseball paraphernalia for the American soldiers both while in training in this country and after they go to France.

ASK THAT HERO BE CANNED

Jefferson Grand Jury Alleges Abuse of Power

The removal of George A. Hero as president of the Jefferson-Plaquemines drainage district is recommended by the grand jury of Jefferson parish in its report to Judge John E. Fleury.

In properties that Mr. Hero is materially interested in he claims that the power and authority delegated to him by the drainage commission fortifies him in doing such drainage work as in his judgment he sees fit.

"In other properties where he has no material interest but slight interest we find Mr. Hero taking advantage of technicalities and claiming that he is powerless to proceed unless specifically authorized. In other words, Mr. Hero has the authority where it pleases this gentleman and waives the authority where and when he pleases.

"Failing in this, we recommend that representation be made to the governor, the Hon. R. G. Pleasant, that the summary removal from office of Mr. Hero follow."

LEONARD LOOKS LIKE THE WINNER

New York, May 25. - Benny Leonard will be the favorite when he faces Freddie Welsh in a ten-round bout here May 28.

The first of these is the fact that he carries a knockout punch in his right hand, and the second lies in the belief that Welsh is in fact going back. Welsh's poor showing against Johnny Kilbane, regardless of alibis that have been made for him, has lowered his stock in the estimation of Gotham boxing fans.

Leonard is a popular favorite throughout the country because he knocks out his opponents. His knockout victory over Richie Mitchell was proof enough for the boxing bugs of the West, though it did not surprise those in the East who know how hard Leonard can hit.

Since knocking Mitchell out, Leonard has floored all comers with that deadly right-hand wallop to the "button." His punch is no fluke. It carries sleeping poison with it and Benny can put it over like a flash.

Welsh's latest declaration to the effect that he will meet any title aspirant over the twenty-round route has been taken with a grain of salt by Leonard and his followers.

In two former bouts with Welsh Leonard has learned his style. He knows just what to expect from Welsh, and he has more confidence now than he has ever had in his life.

Should Leonard annex the lightweight championship he will prove a popular champion because he is not a staller. He goes into the ring to knock opponents out, and the boxing public has always idolized a champion of this calibre.
