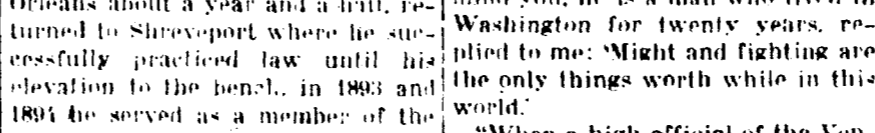
WIND FREAKS IN RECENT TORNADO
