GIANT BUGLE WAKES WEARY PLATTSBURGERS



THE PART NIAGARA FALLS TAKES IN PROVIDING WAR MATERIALS

How America's greatest waterfall has enlisted for war service is told in a striking communication to the National Geographic Society from William Joseph Showalter, a part of which was issued today as one of the Society's war geography bulletins.

"When Niagara power was first developed, efforts to make artificial grinding materials were proving a failure because of the lack of electric current at a price the new venture could afford to pay.

"There is another alloy of iron indispensable in war, and well-nigh so in twentieth century peace—ferro-silicon.

"No shell goes to Europe whose nose has not been ground into shape on Niagara-made grindstones.

"While the process of ferro-silicon manufacture were being perfected another lesson was learned. Quartz, you remember, is the geologist's thermometer for its formal between narrow ranges of temperature.

"If it is properly heated, there forms around the central core of coke a great array of crystals, large and small, almost as hard as diamonds.

NEW NUMBERS FOR MEN REGISTERED

The task of renumbering the registration cards for the selection of the new national army is being completed today by the exemption boards of the sixteen wards in Kansas City and the board in charge of Jackson county outside of Kansas City, says the Kansas City Star.

The new numbers will not correspond, except in rare instances, with the numbers appearing on the cards of the men that registered June 5.

A Change in the Plans
This indicates a change in the draft plans of the war department. It was first announced the men would be called by the precinct numbers given them when they registered.

Various Ways of Numbering
Some of the registration boards took the registration cards in alphabetical order in renumbering them. Others numbered them at random.

One Way of Selecting Considered
One of the methods of drawing names of drafted men considered by President Wilson's special advisory board was announced in Washington today.

By this plan, as many numbers as the highest serial number of the largest registration division in the nation would be placed in a receptacle and drawn at random.
