The property was to have been sold today to satisfy a mortgage judgment for \$2,500 held by the Citizen's Homestead association,

The property involved was inherited by Mrs. Sarah Dugue and Adelaide Johnston from the estate of Miss Ruth Johnstoon, At the time the latter's succession was opened, it was believed that they were the legal heirs, according to the petition, and they accepted the property without an administration. Now it is asserted that Ruth

Johnston had a child named Lillian Johnston; that the child was adopted by the Dugues and has been go-f ing under the name of Lillian Dugue. As a natural child of Ruth Johnston, it is asserted, Lilliam Dugue was entitled to her mother's property, and the claim is now advanced in her behalf.
