NO CESSATION IN WAR ON RATS

Four thousand six hundred twenty rats were trapped in New Orleans during the week ending July 14, 1917, according to a report submitted yesterday by J. Holmes Smith, Jr., past assistant surgeon and now temporarily in charge of the United States Public Health Service at New Orleans.

To date, says the report, there are 145,770 rat-proofed buildings in New Orleans. The activity of rat-proofing has been abated as there has not been a case of human plague in the city since Sept. 8, 1915.
