CONFERENCE OF COMMISSIONERS
ON UNIFORM STATE LAWS

The twenty-seventh annual meeting of the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws will be held at Saratoga from August 29th to September 3d, just preceding the meeting of the American Bar Association and will be particularly important and interesting.

Among the uniform laws to be considered will be those on: "Conditional Sales," "Fraudulent Conveyances," "Flag Law," "Motor Vehicles," "Business Corporations," "Non-resident Corporations," "Occupational Diseases," and act preparing forms for the "Land Registration Act."

The commissioners from Louisiana are W. O. Hart, R. S. Thornton and I. D. Wall. All expect to attend and take part in the proceedings. Mr. Hart is a member of the executive committee and Mr. Thornton and Mr. Wall are members of important other Committees.

CITY AND STATE NEWS IN BRIEF

Work upon the buildings necessary for the National Army soon to be assembled is proceeding rapidly at Camp Beauregard, near Alexandria, La., and Camp Shelby, near Hattiesburg, Miss. At Camp Beauregard over 2,000 men are employed.

Thibodaux has organized a company of the Home Guard between 15 and 60.

Strong contrasts are found in the exemption board news. In West Feliciana parish every man summoned on the first call was of perfect physique and only one claimed exemption. In the Second district of St. Landry 98 per cent of all who passed the physical examination claimed exemption.

Judge Prentiss Carter has summoned the Mayor and commissioners of Covington to appear before him Oct. 7 and show cause why they should not be punished for contempt in violating an order of court.

Dr. Dowling in Shreveport, started a state-wide campaign against patient medicines.

T. L. Huber of New Orleans is president, J. J. A. Fortier secretary and treasurer and J. Herman McMahon of DeRidder vice-president of the Huber Motor Co., incorporated in Calcasieu, which will maintain offices in Lake Charles and DeRidder.

Baton Rouge, besides entertaining 500 boys and girls for the agricultural short course last week, also had a state meeting of farm demonstration agents.
