Practically the entire Louisiana 40 per cent quota of selection for the Eighty-seventh Division arrived at Camp Pike Thursday. Out of the 7500 men who were registered at the receiving depot approximately 4000 were Louisianians. The new arrivals are in high spirits and appear to like the camp.

Before only half a dozen men, the property of the Orleans-Kenner Railway Company was offered for sale by William Dufour, special master, at the new courthouse at noon Thursday. No bidder appeared for the reason that Judge Foster had fixed an upset price of \$400,000.

Christopher Fioke, 47 years old, a well known longshoreman, was drowned in the river at Westwego while at work on a ship Tuesday afternoon. The accident was not generally known on this side of the river until Thursday, when members of the family offered a reward for the recovery of the body.

Hayne of Battery C, Washington Artillery, was ordered Friday night by District Attorney Luzeberg, following his probe into the accident. Randazzo will be charged with manslaughter.

Mayor Behrman announced his appointment of two additional members of the committee to represent New Orleans in Paris at the coming Bicentennial anniversary of the giving to Bienville of his royal commission to found New Orleans. The new appointees are J. Vergone, retired merchant and J. W. Montgomery.

A triple section dehydrating, utilization and incinerating plant, to cost from one and a quarter to one and a half million dollars, from money borrowed on the unsecured credit of the city, will be in operation within fourteen months, Commissioner Lafaye announced Friday on his return from New York. Mr. Lafaye said he had completed arrangements to borrow the money without further security than the promise of the city to repay. He instance this as proof of the high credit of New Orleans.
