CITY AND STATE NEWS IN BRIEF

Commissioner Lafayette said Thursday he will decline the proposition of E. E.rees of the Mid-Continental Hog Company of Denver to purchase the garbage of the city at a price of \$100 a day because he believes the garbage to be worth considerably more than this to the city.

The resignation Thursday morning of Detective Walter P. Methe was the third coming from members of that department since the eventful day of August 2, when Superintendent Reynolds and Captain Mulren were killed. Detectives Joseph McCabe and Michael J. Coyle were the others.

Methe's resignation was given Superintendent Mooney at 10 o'clock Thursday morning and at once accepted.

J. A. Bass, painter, 40 years old, who met a violent death Thursday morning when weights of an elevator in the unoccupied building at 528 Canal street descended on his neck, breaking it, was laid at rest at 3:30 o'clock Friday in St. Bartholomew's Cemetery, Algiers.

Following dissolution of the law firm of Dinkelspiel Hart and Davey, the two-story brick building, 134 Carondelet street, has been purchased from Max Dinkelspiel by W. O. Hart, who will continue his law practice there. Mr. Hart paid \$25,575 for the building and office fixtures.

The affidavit charges that Haag was libeled in a letter sent by Mr. Bailey to Superintendent Mooney, charging that gambling was conducted in Haag's place.

All is harmony in the Business Men's Racing Association following the meeting Friday night of the "imparting" committee, representing a minority number of the stockholders in the association, with the board of directors. The committee was composed of Albert Tujague, chairman; Dr. Hamlet Moore and Dr. John A. Kyles.

Henry Smith, ladderman of Truck No. 7 who was injured Thursday night in a collision between the truck and the hose wagon of Engine Company No. 49, died in the Charity Hospital after midnight Saturday morning. Both the truck and the hose wagon were responding to an alarm of fire and ran together at Oak and Dublin streets.
